

ASPIRE Litmus Test

As a general litmus test for each proposed project, ARC and the Members of the Collaborative (or collectively "Membership") ask ourselves:

Does this idea address an unmet need?

Has the concept been developed with/from community insight?

Has this idea been vetted/validated as a priority within the community?

Will this project benefit all people living with Amyloidosis?

Does the proposed project meet the mandate of the Collaborative, including:

Feasibility

Scalability, with a particular focus on expanding access and inclusivity

Maximization of resources

Generation of efficiencies

Creation of measurable, demonstrable impact

Promotion of pathways for collaboration with other stakeholders/KOL's

Is there energy, excitement, and interest from Members in the proposed project?

Is a Member or other organization already doing it?

Will the proposed project make a unique contribution or is there sound justification to support Collaborative engagement to enhance or scale impact of the ongoing initiatives?

Is the Collaborative best placed to do this or should the project be spun out as a separate work stream, led by one or more of the Members and/or by ARC, independent from the Collaborative?

If the Collaborative is best placed to implement a project, who else do we need to engage as partners and how?

If the Collaborative is not best placed to implement the project, or there is not sufficient interest from Members, ARC can facilitate discussion with Members who have expressed interest in independently implementing the project.
